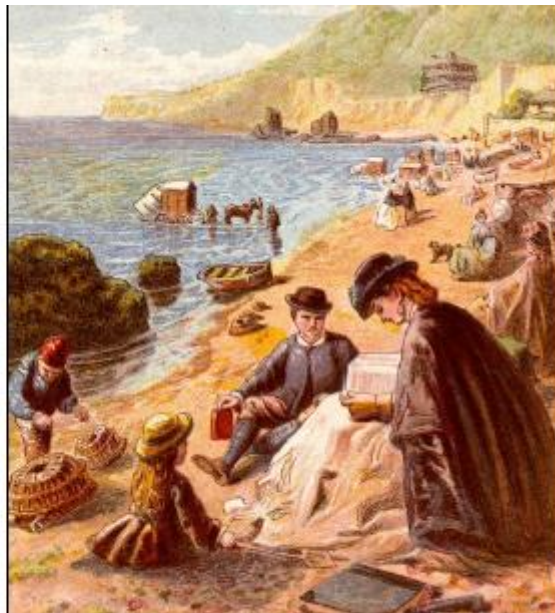


A Victorian steam train
