

Maths

Today we are going to practise counting money. Before we begin, look at the different coins we use and talk about how much they are worth, their shape, size and colour. We will be using 1p and 2p coins. A 2p coin is worth the same as two 1p coins. In school when we are learning to count money, we tap the 1p coins once and the 2p coins twice as we count.



Using 1p and 2p coins make the following amounts:

4p, 7p, 10p, 13p, 18p

Can you make any of them just using 2p coins? Why is this?

You might like to have a try at using a 5p coin too. In school when we are learning to count money using a 5p coin we start with the 5p and say 'five' and then count on the rest of the coins.

Using 1p, 2p and 5p coins make the following amounts:

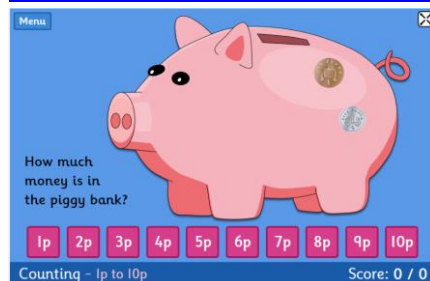
6p, 9p, 11p

If you needed to use two 5p coins remember that $5p + 5p = 10p$.

You might even like to try counting money using a 10p coin!

Here is a link for a game to try. Select 'counting' and then '1p to 10p'.

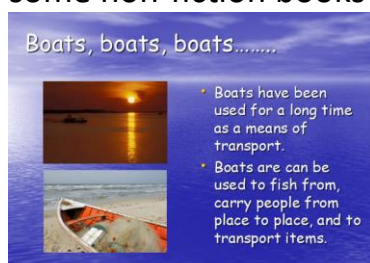
