



MathsThis week we are going to be thinking about money.I would like you to look at the different coins (real ones would be super, but if not, you can use the photo below).Image: the photo below below

I would like you to practise recognising the coins until you are super confident. Look at the different shapes and colours of the coins to help you distinguish between them. Some of the coins even have how much they are worth print on them, can you see any?

Practical activity -

I would like you to make a shop using toys/objects from around your home. Ask a grown up to help you write price tags for the different objects (they need to be whole values of coins ie, 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1, £2, as this is solely to practise recognising coins).

Take turns with your adult being the shop keeper and being the customer. You will need to use the shop again this week, so if you can, keep the tags on your items.

A list can be a really useful way of writing things down. When you make a list, each new item is written under the last. When might you want to use a list?

Today you are going to make a shopping list! You are going to write a list of food that you would eat at a street party. What sort of food would you have at a street part?
