We continue further with our underwater themed learning this week...

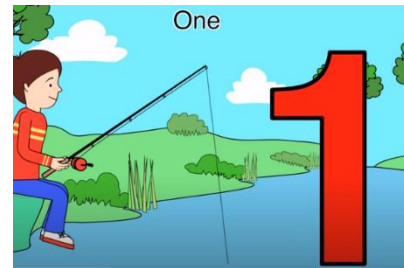

Challenge!

Practise writing the numerals 0-10 using correct number formation by starting at the red dot and following the arrow and using 'Froggy Fingers' pencil grip. Can you collect objects from around the house to match your number?

Art:**Paper Plate Fish!**

You will need –

- A paper plate
- Paint, felt pens or pencils in bright colours
- Sellotape
- White paper cake cases, glue stick (optional)
- Googly eye or spare button



1. First, cut a triangular shaped 'mouth' into one side of the paper plate fish. Then sellotape this to the opposite side on the back to form the fish tail (ridges from the edge of the plate to the outside).
2. Next, colour the fish and tail with stripes, spots or plain colours like in the examples below.
3. Then, support your child to fold a paper cake case into quarters and snip right across the point to make a flat edge. Open the cake case back out and snip down the folds just made to make 4 'scales'. Use a glue stick to attach these half way across the body in rows towards the tail.
4. Lastly, glue on googly eye or button for an eye!
