A -You could have any of these answers

- "a twisted old woman"
- "face like the bark of a tree"
- "horrible claw hands"
- "fierce red eyes like poisonous berries"
- 5. 'Her touch nipped like pepper?' What do you think this means?

A - Jub's arm stung where the old woman touched her.

6. Why doesn't Jub want the old woman to take the sack?

A – You could have any of these answers

• She is frightened the old woman might snatch them away.

- She does not like the old woman.
- It is none of the old woman's business.
- She knows how important the Happy Endings are and she does not want any harm to come to them.
