Dear Parents/Carers,

What a very busy week.....

Today Class 3 and 4 have had a 'Ducktastic' time raising money for their class charity 'The Durham Wildlife Trust'. They started the day with a duck hunt, as 200 tiny ducks had escaped in their classrooms. They managed to catch 198 of these, but there are still two missing - we are sure they will turn up soon! They have also played lots of duck games, made duck headbands and had a duck parade around school, they have had great fun..... they are very lucky ducks!

Ms Metcalfe and I have been observing lessons this week and we are looking forward to more next week! In Year 3 children were sampling different types of breads and explaining their preferences. They enjoyed looking at the process of how to make bread and sampled Olive bread, Rye and even Garlic & Coriander Naan bread. We also saw the delight on the children's faces when a selection of fruit was unveiled and they worked hard to explore, sort and classify them into groups. Year 6 have been debating about the General Election and sharing their knowledge regarding voting and manifestos – well done to you all.

Also, this week Classes 9 and 10 participated in a full day of felt making, which the children really enjoyed! They took great care to follow the process and produced some amazing pieces of art. This was completed under the instruction of Heidi - a visiting artist. Many thanks to the parents who gave up their day to help out – we hope you enjoyed it too!

On Thursday our athletics squad made the short trip to Easington Colliery Primary for the School Games athletics event. It was a huge event with 22 schools attending and around 250 children participating. Both our boys and girls' teams did an amazing job and for some of our pupils it was their first ever competitive event for the school. We did brilliantly in our running heats with the boys all finishing in first place and progressing to the final, whilst our girls had 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 6th place finishes. In the final we were just as impressive. Cole 'Farah' dominated the 800m to claim the first spot, Charlie won the 60m, whilst Josh and Louis came 3rd and 2nd in the 100m and 60m hurdles respectively. In the girls 60m final, Megan came 4th in an extremely tight race. Our girls' relay team were extremely unlucky to miss out on a final place in their relay despite winning their heat comfortably, only missing out by 0.2 of a second. The boys relay team finished 2nd meaning they will also represent Easington in the County athletics final on July 2nd. In the field events we were extremely competitive and gave some very impressive performances. Megan came 3rd in the girls' long jump, Louis threw 11m in the shot put whilst Louie C threw 26m in the throw. Poppy, Sofia and Isabella came in the top half of their events whilst Josh will represent the County in the

long jump. Out of the 22 schools we came 4th, only narrowly missing out on a medal. An amazing achievement from everyone involved.

CLASS DOJO: We are very pleased to announce that our admin team now have access to Class Dojo. This means you can message them directly for appointments or admin enquiries. You can send them a message under “Admin” in the message section.

We always need to speak to families when children are off school ill, therefore please continue to advise of any sickness absence by telephone.

You may have noticed that there have been a number of updates to Class Dojo recently. There has been a group messaging function added, which allows parents to include more than one teacher in a message. You may also now receive a 'class announcement' which are important messages sent directly to all parents in the class. Please ensure you have the most recent version downloaded to ensure this works correctly. If you have any difficulties accessing Class Dojo please let us and know and we will try to help.

Please be aware that teachers may not always respond to messages straight away as they are busy in class and teachers may not reply outside of school hours. If you query is urgent, please contact the school office directly.

AIR-UP BOTTLES: We have noticed in KS2 a lot of children are bringing “Air-Up” water bottles to school. (Fancy water bottles which have a scented pod at the top to trick you into thinking you are drinking flavoured water). They are very trendy at the moment and popular on TikTok. However, these bottles start at £39.95 – and therefore as a school **we will not accept any liability** in the event your child’s bottle is lost or broken.

ASSEMBLIES: Our “Celebration Assemblies” are continuing along with our “Citizenship Assemblies”. The “Citizenship Assemblies” are designed to help our children become responsible and informed members of our local, national and international communities. Every Monday, children in KS1 and KS2 will attend a Citizenship Assembly. In these assemblies, children come together in the Key Stages to reflect upon and learn about a diverse range of issues. Citizenship Assemblies are always age-appropriate. They cover topics such as:

News Items (such as elections or the jubilee)

Stories about inspirational people

Special days or months (Black History Month, International Womens Day)

Personal safety (anti-bullying week and internet safety)

ONLINE SAFETY: The game “PC Horror puzzle game” which is PEGI rated 12+ is not suitable for younger children. However, the game is being imitated on the popular game Roblox and it is also very popular on Youtube. Because of the innocent name of the game many videos are not being picked up by YouTube’s filters. We urge parents to be vigilant in what their children are playing and watching online.

BREAKFAST CLUB: Can we kindly remind you that due to insurance purposes we cannot allow pupils to enter site before 7.45am for Breakfast Club and that the Day Gate buzzer will not be answered before this time. Also there is no access to Breakfast Club through the staff car park. Thank you.

ROAD SAFETY: Please can we remind parents **NOT** to use the entrance to the school in Waveney Rd as a turning circle, as there has been damage done to the fence and it can cause a problem for staff entering the site. Thank you.

BIKES & SCOOTERS: Please can we remind you that bikes and scooters are **not** to be used on school site as this is a safety hazard. Thank you.

LUNCHES: Please inform the school office if you would like to change your child to either packed lunch or school dinners, we need 2 weeks notice to make the necessary changes. Thank you.

SCHOOL MEAL CHARGES: As of Monday 1st April 2024 school meals have increased to £2.81 per day (£14.05 per week) until 31st March 2025. **Preschool meals are at a cost of £3.37 per day (£16.85 per week).**

WEARABLE TECHNOLOGY: Please could we remind parents that pupils are not allowed to wear Apple watches or Smart watches in school as they can be connected to the Internet and are also expensive items.

JEWELLERY: Small stud earrings can be worn but necklaces, bracelets and other hooped or dangle earrings are not allowed for safety reasons. Earrings must be removed for P.E or plasters provided from home to cover them.

BREAKFAST CLUB: Breakfast Club is open to Reception children up to Year 6, this does not need to be booked but will need to be paid for in advance please through Parentpay. The cost per day is £2 for the first child and £1 for any siblings.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB: 'Night Owls' Club must be booked via the office (NOT on Class Dojo) and paid for 1 week in advance via Parentpay. The club is open to Reception children up to Year 6 from Monday to Thursday. Due to low numbers there is no club on Friday.

Collection is via the day gate which needs to be pushed as it does not open automatically and from the small hall doors next to reception. We do not release children to walk down the drive for safeguarding reasons. Siblings must be minimum 14 yrs of age to collect other siblings and a form will need to be completed to authorise this. **Children must be collected no later than 5 pm.** The cost per day is £4.00 for the first child and £3.50 for any siblings.

CONTACT DETAILS: Please can you ensure we have up to date contact numbers in case of illness or accidents in school.

PACKED LUNCHES: We operate as a healthy school. Children with sweets and chocolates will not be able to eat them at lunchtime so please do not put them in their lunch boxes. We ask children to take their rubbish or leftovers home for parents/carers to see what they have eaten.

PARENTPAY: Please pay by card rather than bank transfer as these take longer to process. Please pay for dinners either weekly or monthly in advance.

SCHOOL TIMES:

Gates open 8.40 am and close at 8.55 am, reopen at 3 pm and close at 3.30 pm.

Preschool entry 8.50 am, gate opens for collection 2.45pm.

Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 8.55am - 3.15 pm

Classes 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12G, 12M 8.55am-3.20 pm

POLITE REMINDERS:

Contact the office to report sickness as messages via Dojo do not come to the office.

Complete a leave of absence form for any time taken out of school time.

Contact the office if your child has to attend an appointment- they do not have access to Dojo.

Keep your dog on a lead and away from the entrances.

In line with DCC policy this is a non smoking site including vapes.

Please do not play loud music in your car whilst waiting for your child, as this can be disruptive for our neighbours. Thank you.
