What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has at January of that year. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, and increase participation in PE and Sport.

At Shotton Hall Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

Impact of 2023-24 Sports Premium Funding

The sports premium was used to positively impact our school in the following ways:

- to improve provision and support for PE
- to provide high quality resources for both staff and pupils to ensure PE teaching and learning is of a high standard
- to increase whole school participation in sports events, festivals and competitions
- to ensure all pupils engage in regular high quality PE
- to provide opportunities that enable all pupils be involved in physical activity during break times
- to fund the development of the playmakers scheme

Plans for 2024/25 Sports Premium Funding

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil. Our Sports funding therefore is £18970

How we will use the funding in 2024/25

The Sports funding is to be used to develop the following areas:

1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
3. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.



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The funding will be used to, but not restricted to:

- Provide high quality CPD for all staff
- Provide high quality coaching to further develop staff confidence
- To ensure that the curriculum is matched to the needs of our pupils
- Prepare children for competitive sport
- Provide funding for transportation to and from sporting events
- Invest in equipment to provide varied and high quality sport provision.
- Finance sports coaching to deliver sports clubs during break times and after school
- Provide a range of high quality equipment for break-times
- Deliver intra-school tournaments to give every child a taste of competitive sport
- Develop children's confidence and social skills through the use of sport
- To provide further swimming support to increase the percentage of pupils who achieve national swimming targets
- To provide opportunities that increase physical activity during break times

Additional Funding

Shotton Hall Primary School is committed to raising the profile of PESSPA across the whole school. We believe that engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity will kick-start a lifelong plan to maintain a healthy and active lifestyle.
